

## **E-Safety Tips for Accessing Home Learning**

At Eden Park we recognise that many of the home learning tasks being set whilst the children are not in school require the use of digital technologies. As such, here are our top tips for keeping pupils safe whilst online:

- Keeping Personal Information Safe Children will already have accounts for the main websites
  that we have asked them to use (such as Times Tables Rock Stars). If you or your child is looking
  to access a different site, which requires you to 'register' or 'signup', check the website looks
  safe to use. Help children to choose a suitable/safe password and remind them to never
  post/give out personal information online (address, full name, phone numbers etc)
- Set Up Parental Controls If you have not done so already, now is a great time to ensure all of
  your devices have appropriate parental controls. <a href="InternetMatters.org">InternetMatters.org</a> has clear guides for almost
  all mobile/Wi-Fi networks and devices including smart speakers.
- Supervise Research Time If your child is carrying out research for an activity they are working
  on, we recommend they do this in a family space, where you can discuss what they are
  researching and you can see the content they are viewing. Use safe search engines such as
  Swiggle or Kids-search. Safe search settings can also be activated on Google and other search
  engines, as well as YouTube.
- Manage Screen Time Whilst many activities can be completed online, they may not need
  access to a screen for all of the task. Make sure your child gets regular breaks from using
  technology and think of different ways you could complete the task. Check out this advice for
  balancing screen time.
- YouTube We may direct you to view certain educational videos or videos created by Eden Park teachers on YouTube. We recommend children view these in a family environment, so that their viewing can be supervised.
- Stay Involved Ensuring you have a good understanding of how your child uses technology and
  what content they are viewing is essential in keeping children safe. Be clear what your child can
  and can't do online where they can use the internet, how much time they can spend online,
  the sites they can visit and the type of information they can share. Have time exploring together
  and getting them to show you what they have been doing.
